NATURE NOTE

Why are our lakes dropping?



Evaporation is based on several factors – how warm the water is and the air above it, how much wind blows over a lake during the course of a day, what altitude you are at, and what the humidity level is.

The University of Missouri maintains a series of “pan stations” across the state where they measure evaporation rates – and this

summer the rate has been about .3 inches a day. That is a lot of water going into the air.

Look at Lake Aspen for instance. At 150 acres and based on the fact that there is 27,154 gallons in one acre inch of water, that means we lose 1.22 million gallons/day from Aspen to evaporation. To figure out how much your lake loses to evaporation, just figure surface area multiplied by 27,154. And then multiply that by .3.
