GARDEN CLUB PLANT PROFILE

Siberian Bugloss (*Brunnera macrophylla*)

In April or May you may think you are seeing forget-me-nots in your garden, but if you plant "Brunnera macrophylla" you may actually be looking at the wonderful ground-cover for shade: Siberian Bugloss. We will offer this plant at the Village of Innsbrook Garden Club spring plant sale this year on Saturday, May 7 (*see details on page 1*). Deer and rabbit resistant, these plants have already been tested at Innsbrook. Shade loving, they do well in woodland gardens or naturalized along streams or ponds.



"Bugloss' is from Greek, meaning 'ox tongue' and is probably due to the roughness and shape of the leaves. In my garden, deer have eaten the blossoms, but never the leaves. Good news, because this woodland plant is valued both for its flowers and ground-covering leaves. Terminal clusters of delicate blue flowers appear in spring. This plant loves shade and a moist, well-drained soil."

nature notes

GARDENING FOR BUTTERFLIES

Butterfly watching ranks high among outdoor pleasures. Butterflies need a lot to eat to supply the energy they need for flying. Some Innsbrook property owners who participate in our Community Garden use their plots not for fruits and vegetables, but to plant a variety of flowers that attract these whimsical, delicate creatures. It is important to provide food for the larval stage of butterflies as well. Sometimes getting the butterflies you want is as easy as growing the plant the larvae feed on! Most butterflies lay their eggs on certain species or families of plants. Monarchs prefer milkweeds. Black swallowtail larvae do well on dill and carrot tops. Fritillaries prefer violet leaves. A wealth of butterflies indicates the overall well-being of the local ecosystem. Butterflies are a good measure of good gardening!

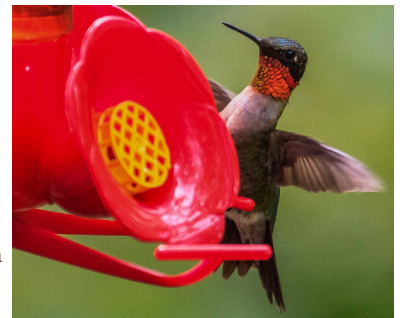

GET THOSE HUMMINGBIRD FEEDERS OUT!

Hummingbirds find Innsbrook to be a summertime haven much like Innsbrook property owners do! According to the migration tracking map at www.hummingbirds.net, the first sightings of ruby-throated hummingbirds in our area were reported the first week of April. Fill your hummingbird feeders with a simple solution: Mix four parts water to one part sugar to make a nectar that they love. Be sure to change the nectar weekly and clean the feeder very well to reduce the growth of bacteria, which can sicken these incredible little avian acrobats.



If you've never hung a hummingbird feeder before, give it a try this year! You won't be disappointed when you catch your first glimpse of these tiny birds.
