### \*SAFE VIEWING OF THE ECLIPSE\*

Specialized eclipse glasses are required for safe viewing of the sun — looking at the sun directly, even during an eclipse, can cause permanent eye damage. Eyewear should be ISO- and CE-certified.

# Great American Eclipse — August 21, 2017 — Innsbrook, Missouri

The Innsbrook Nature Group has created a guide for watching the eclipse, which can be found on their website here:

<https://ibknature.com/events/solar-eclipse-2017/>. Below is an excerpt from their guide.

The partial eclipse at Innsbrook will start at 11:48 a.m. To begin with, only a small part of the sun is covered by the moon. Use your glasses to watch as the moon moves across the sun.

As more and more of the sun is covered by the moon, you'll see shadows getting sharper, temperatures getting lower and the sky getting darker. Just before the moon completely covers the sun, it will get significantly darker and you may see "the diamond ring effect." For a second, you see the faint ring of the sun's last crescent of light and then the bright (diamond) flash of the last glimpse of the sun. How will all the wildlife react? Look and listen to find out!

The total eclipse at Innsbrook will be 1 minute and 51 seconds long, occurring between 1:15-1:17 p.m. That is the ONLY TIME it is safe to look at the sun's corona with the naked eye. Sometimes, you can see red or pink prominences, small tongues of hot material jutting outwards. The world will be dark, but it's a darkness that is not quite like night and nothing like a cloudy day. You will notice the absence of sound as the wind dies down. The stars will come out at midday! The brightest light will be the sun reflecting off Venus.

During the eclipse, four planets will come out of the darkness for a rare daytime viewing: Venus, Jupiter, Mars and Mercury. Learn how to spot them at <http://bit.ly/IBK-planets>.

At 1:17, you may see another diamond ring as the sun emerges from behind the moon. Then it's time for the glasses again as the moon slowly moves off the sun. It will all be over by 2:42 p.m., and many of us can then claim to be one of the lucky few to have seen a total solar eclipse.

## Eclipse Trivia

*When was the last time St. Louis experienced a total solar eclipse? Way back in 1442!*

*How wide is the path of totality in Missouri? About 70 miles.*

*When was the last time Missouri experienced a total solar eclipse? 1869.*

*How long does it take for the eclipse to pass over the entire U.S.? About 90 minutes, starting in Oregon and leaving in South Carolina.*

*How fast is the full eclipse shadow moving across the land? An average of 1,700 miles per hour!*

## nature note

### NATURE IN TOTALITY

You may be ready for the big total eclipse on August 21 and know where and how you will experience it. Wildlife doesn't plan ahead for totality, but many species have been observed responding in differing ways.

As the sky begins darkening into a mid-day twilight, temperatures will drop by as much as 10-15 degrees and animals will react to changing light and weather cues. Before

the eclipse, many daytime animals will be out and about like normal. However, in the short span of totality, day and night species have been known to switch places. Daytime species have quieted and returned to nests, roosts and woods. Nighttime animals have been known to emerge. You may hear cicadas, crickets, frogs, owls and night hawks and see bats flying during the darkness.

After the sun returns, birds have begun singing a morning chorus as if it were dawn again. Roosters have been known to crow again and frogs have begun croaking loudly.

A 1930's *Journal of Science* study from a total solar eclipse in New England found that during the second half of totality, mosquitoes emerged from grasses and trees in swarms and began biting in force. Fish in hatcheries stopped eating, some birds flew into houses and honeybees swarmed hives in droves before the light disappeared. Butterflies and moths have been disturbed in past studies as they use the light for navigation.

Some nervous pets have been known to react so it's been recommended to keep them inside during the eclipse.

Listen and watch what Innsbrook wildlife does around you as you witness the total solar eclipse!
