SOUND THE HORNS! TRUMPETER SWANS RETURN TO INNSBROOK

Innsbrook property owners who live on or around Alpine Lake may have seen our visitors from the north in February — trumpeter swans, who, with a nearly eight-foot wingspan, are North America's largest waterfowl. Trumpeter swans were formerly a common migrant statewide and summer resident in northern Missouri. Currently, individuals and family groups winter in Missouri, foraging in shallow water. Upon observing the swans, Innsbrook property owner Michael Grewe reached out to The Trumpeter Swan Society (TTSS) to see if there were any steps he could take to keep them coming back. TTSS Executive Director Margaret Smith provided Michael with the following information, which he shared with us:



"They will be migrating back soon to their nesting grounds, probably in the next couple weeks if not before, depending on the weather. Swans imprint on their nesting grounds/area and return to that area each spring. New pairs find new nesting grounds, but generally in the area where they themselves hatched. They will migrate to their nesting grounds in late winter and then return to their wintering grounds in late fall/early winter. Swans will continue to find new wintering grounds as they explore regions, are blown off course, etc. Most of it depends on open water."

Our Midwest swans are descended from swan eggs collected in Alaska and had no migration traditions. They had to pioneer into new wintering areas, which they continue to do today.

"Missouri reported the highest number of swans this winter they have ever reported with more than 1,000 counted at the Riverlands Migratory Bird Sanctuary in December 2017," said Smith. Here at Innsbrook, we also appear to be having a record year, as a total of 15 trumpeter swans have enjoyed Alpine's open water, more than twice as many as what has been reported in the past!
