Construction Updates

New Amenity Complex:

As spring and summer draw near, we want to update you on what is happening at Innsbrook. It is with heavy hearts that we announce that the pool will not be open this summer season. The main contributors to the delay have been weather, permitting and design.

Certain new processes implemented by applicable government agencies have made it clear to us that we need additional approvals to move forward with this project, and until we get that approval we cannot proceed. We have never run into this issue before..... and it came as a total surprise.

While waiting for the weather and permitting issues to be resolved, we have been able to take that additional time to further improve the design of the facility.

What do we need to start construction?

- Cooperative weather
- Approved permits
- Finalized designs

Once these conditions are met, we are confident that the pool facility will be on a six month construction schedule. We will keep you informed of the progress on our website and again in the spring *Innsight* newsletter.

NATURE NOTE



Bluebirds Return

Spring is officially here and the signs of the season are popping up everywhere. The first warm days of February and March send our treasured bluebirds looking for a place to nest. Bluebirds have come

to rely on nest boxes specially designed for them. A designer bluebird box has an entrance hole of precisely one and one-half inches in diameter – large enough for bluebirds but too small for most competitors and predators. Bluebirds are about four times as abundant as they were two decades ago, thanks partly to all the folks who have put up bluebird nest boxes. You'll see such boxes throughout Innsbrook, as a dedicated group of volunteers maintain them and monitor the bluebird count throughout the season (*see more on page 4*).

PLANT PROFILE

Lady's Mantle - "Alchemilla mollis"

Easily grown in average, medium moisture, with well-drained soils in full sun to part shade, but tolerates close to full shade. Prefers part afternoon shade in hot summer climates. Performs well in moist garden areas. Freely self-seeds in the garden to the point of being somewhat invasive in optimum growing conditions. Prompt removal of spent flower stems will not only prevent self-seeding but may also encourage a sparse, late summer re-bloom. Divide plants as needed. In hot summer climates such as St. Louis, Lady's Mantle leaves may scorch in full sun exposures or if soils are permitted to dry out.

This plant is yet untested by the Innsbrook Garden Club. I ran across it in Wisconsin where the deer did not bother it. The leaves are fuzzy and deer usually do not nibble them. The research says it is deer resistant and may be grown in full sun or partial shade.

Innsbrook Bluebird Monitors Update Nesting Boxes

Thanks to the generosity of the Innsbrook Garden Club and some wood scraps from the Innsbrook Log Cabin renovation, almost a fourth of the bluebird nesting boxes that are monitored weekly in Innsbrook will be replaced this spring. A dozen Innsbrook property owners monitor 106 bluebird nesting boxes throughout our community on a weekly basis during bluebird nesting season, which starts soon. The project was started almost 20 years ago by the late Dr. Bob Clark, who also founded the Innsbrook Garden Club. Over that time, we have fledged over 6,000 bluebirds. Many of the original nesting boxes needed replacement.

Over the winter, a team of the monitors got together and built 25 new boxes, which will be installed in time for the start of bluebird nesting season. The design of our nesting boxes has evolved over many years to not only provide good shelter for the birds, but to be easy for the monitors to check and clean.
