Toilet Connector Class Action Settlement

If you have a toilet with a Watts Toilet Connector, you could get benefits from a class action settlement. A settlement has been reached with Watts Water Technologies, Inc. and Watts Regulator Co. ("Watts") regarding Toilet Connectors with Coupling Nuts made with acetal plastic designed, manufactured, and/or distributed by Watts between 1999 and July 2009. Acetal is a type of plastic material. The settlement covers the purchase and possession of a Watts Toilet Connector as well as payments made to repair property damage suffered as a result of the failure of a Watts Toilet Connector. The supply lines in question are the braided type and will generally have a tag with the company name "Watts" but the tag may have been removed during the installation. If you have a braided toilet supply and the manufacturer is unknown, replacing it would be prudent. Visit www.toiletconnector.com for more info. Ext. 176.

Fishing Rules and Regulations

All of the lakes at Innsbrook are well stocked. Alpine Lake will have a protected slot length limit on bass of 12" to 18", which means you can keep bass under 12" or over 18", with a daily limit of five. All other lakes release bass between 12" and 16". Crappie 10" or longer and bluegill and catfish of any size can be kept (including those from Alpine Lake) with a daily limit of 10 crappie. Release all paddlefish caught. Ext. 193.

NATURE NOTE

Eastern Tent Caterpillars

You may have noticed the silken tents that have begun to blanket the branches of wild cherry and other fruit trees at Innsbrook. Look closely and you'll see the tents are alive with a wiggling mass of colorful, hairy caterpillars. They live as a colony and work together to construct the communal tent.

These caterpillars begin their life cycle as eggs the previous summer. The eggs are enclosed in egg cases that hold from 100-300

eggs, and are laid on trees where the hatched caterpillars will find food. After hatching, the young caterpillars build their tent-like web in a nearby fork of the tree. Through spring, they build continually. The caterpillars leave the web to feed on the tree's leaves. After eating, they return to the



protection of the web.

When full-grown, the caterpillars abandon the web to find places to spin silken cocoons. They emerge from the cocoons in late spring and early summer as light-brown, short-bodied moths. They do not eat as adults. The moths mate, lay eggs and die.
