NATURE NOTE

Down the Rabbit Hole



Adult rabbits seek refuge in small shallow depressions called "forms," but the female digs a deeper burrow for her young. The female only visits the nest to nurse the young in the early morning and at dusk, so she is rarely seen. Her presence at the nest could attract attention, so she keeps watch from a distance. Young rabbits mature

within two weeks and leave the safety of the nest.
