nature note

HUNGRY HUMMINGBIRDS

Want to invite hummingbirds to your yard with an artificial feeder? Here are a few tips!

Buying feeders - Consider a feeder with bee or wasp guards, which are mesh covers that prevent insects from reaching the nectar.

Making "nectar" - Mix four parts water to one part sugar for a nectar substitute. Be sure to clean your feeder well and often to reduce the growth of bacteria. Change the nectar weekly or more often if it becomes cloudy. Do not use honey, artificial sweeteners or red dye.

When to put feeders out - Now! Hummingbirds usually return to Missouri around April 25. If you start feeding them when they arrive, there's a better chance they'll stay at your feeder.

When to take them down - Hummingbird feeding is most successful in late summer and early fall. As nights become regularly cold, rubythroats begin to migrate south. Then it's time to bring your feeders in for a good cleaning and store them for next season!
