SURVIVING WITH THE HELP OF THE FLOCK

A flock of Canada geese are often noticed by their loud honking and some consider this to be a welcoming sign that spring is near.



Pairs of geese bond in the spring as early as their second year of life and stay together until death (sometimes they will find another mate if the other passes). By their fourth year, nearly all are mating. Nests are constructed on the ground near lakes with the nest consisting of dried grass, other vegetation and feathers. Usually three to eight eggs are laid at a time, once a year. The eggs are incubated for 25 to 28 days. Adults lose their flight feathers during incubation and cannot fly for nearly a month. Within a few days of hatching, the young leave the nest and begin walking and swimming.

Canada geese start gathering in flocks in late summer. The young do not leave their parents until after the spring. A Canada goose may live to be 33 years old or more.

These animals are important grazers in wetlands throughout Missouri. When they and other fowl gather in large numbers in areas along migration routes, their impact as grazers is magnified.

When migrating, these birds fly in chevrons, or V-shaped flocks, preserving energy by flying off the current of others in the group. When the frontrunner gets tired, it efficiently moves to another position. In this way, all the birds are able to conserve energy. By being together in the group, the geese are better able to adapt, increasing their chances of survival in the winter.

The Canada goose can travel more than 600 miles in one day and often nests where its parents nested. They live near lakes, rivers, ponds or other small or large bodies of water, and in yards, park lawns and farm fields.
